So exciting to see all the good publicity so many homeschool families are getting in PA newspapers and even in national newspapers. The Eldredge family was interviewed for a positive article in a Fall '86 issue of USA TODAY, with their daughter Grace having several good quotes. Peter Bergson and his 10 year old daughter Amanda Bergson-Shilcock were both interviewed in a long article that appeared in the LOS ANGELES TIMES April 15, 1987. I was interviewed during the research for an article in the CHRISTIAN SCIENCE MONITOR (April 24, 1987). The Allentown newspaper had a long 2 page feature article called "Home Sweet School" about area homeschoolers published April 30, 1987-- including a large photo of Linda Binde and her daughter. Stephanie Wilson and her daughters Vanessa and Lauren were featured in a Pittsburgh Post Gazette article this spring. Amusingly enough, in that article the PGH superintendent worried that homeschooled students might, among other things, miss out on "performance opportunities"-- Vanessa and Lauren and their whole family are all actively involved in ballet and theater and have more time for "performance" than most school children!

These types of positive articles make great "hand-outs" to give to your legislators (or the grandparents!) about the issue of home education. Do send on copies of any articles you come across-- positive or negative. Even one homeschooling mother in PA, Shay Jones, has written an article for her local paper, telling about the Lancaster Home Educators Curriculum Fair. Shay is planning on doing a series of feature pieces about area homeschoolers.

Do keep us informed about policies of your local school district. It is especially helpful for us to have on file copies of local policies-- do send these on. Policies vary so widely on requirements for reporting progress, qualifications of "private tutor", use of school texts and facilities, etc. The newly revised policy of the West Mifflin District (formerly one of the districts that required PA Certification of the "tutor") now states that "CREDIT TOWARD GRADUATION SHALL BE EARNED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S CURRICULUM REGULATIONS". This is much different from the usual policies that say "The school district will not grant 'credit' for courses completed at home and will neither 'promote', 'advance', nor 'graduate' students who complete a series of courses through in-home instruction".
